Dear Parents and Carers, Raising Attainment

Last year we identified that after the summer holidays some children have difficulty



remembering all that they have learned previously in reading and writing. This year we have had great success in ensuring that children have already retained their attainment level far better than they have in previous years. Working with parents, our learning support team and teachers sent home resources for children to practise. This session we continue to improve literacy attainment in an effort to ensure everyone achieves no matter their background. As a result, our raising attainment continues to be a great success!

RAAC Concrete

As you are aware our school has RAAC concrete. Work is ongoing through holidays and generally after the school day in relation to the girls toilets, closely monitored by experts and Council professionals. Learning continues as per usual!

Our outside toilets for girls during break and lunchtime are now in operation and seem to be working well.



During the school day all girls on the first floor use the top floor toilets and those classes on the ground floor use the toilet in the front foyer. No issues have been reported so far with these arrangements.

Over the October holidays our shelter was removed, however there are overhang areas at the doorway entrances to the school where children can shelter if they wish. During wet weather the children remain in their classes through the school day, with activities and games to amuse them.

Primary 3/2

This term P3/2 are working on an enterprise topic for their Interdisciplinary Learning by designing a product which we will create and sell at the Christmas Fayre. To help us learn about budgeting, buying materials and making a profit as part of an enterprise, we will be focusing on



money in our maths lessons! By doing this, we will learn how to calculate costs and give change which will come in handy when running our stall!

Primary 5/4

Primary 5/4 organised a collection for the Helensburgh Foodbank and they were very grateful to receive it during the October holidays. We are currently working on our Enterprise topic, we have been looking at different job roles within a business and are about to apply for a role within our business. We are also learning to add amounts of money, calculate change and budgeting. We have recently started to focus on using a variety openers in our writing, as that is something that we find tricky to do.

Primary 6/5

Primary 6/5 quickly settled into the routine with their new teacher. They are working hard in Numeracy learning all about budgeting, profit and loss. They will apply what they have learned in their enterprise topic as they sell their items for the school fayre, They are also consolidating their times tables.

Our IDL is going really well and we have managed to appoint the whole class into their job roles in our company. We have been carrying out some market research on our product and next week we hope that costing, purchasing and production can begin!

In Literacy we are learning how to use Direct Speech in our writing and ensuring the presentation of our handwriting is consistent and neat. We have been exploring higher order thinking in creating questions for our job interviews and our "Newsround" bulletins. We are thoroughly enjoying our class novel and have explored lots of new vocabulary which we are trying to use in their writing.

Primary 7

Primary 7 have been working exceptionally hard since returning from their October holiday preparing for their class assembly and getting their enterprise project up and running.

Primary 7 have been learning all about Remembrance Day and reflecting on why it is remains such an important day for us to commemorate so many years later. Working hard on their drama and performance skills the class took us back in time to meet the famous



Unknown Warrior. They also made connections between their work on conflict resolution in PATHS and Christmas Day 1914.

In IDL the class have been working hard to get their enterprise business off the ground. After researching job roles, applying for jobs and attending interviews children were all successful in being given a role within the business. Following this the class carry out lots of market research to complete their business plan and secure their startup investment. They are now very excited to begin designing their prototypes and products ready to sell at the upcoming Christmas Fayre.

Learning Centre

The children have been working very hard in the Learning Centre and have enjoyed celebrating Halloween. We had fun with our 'spooky' science and learned how to 'Grow A Monster! In Numeracy the children have been developing their recognition of number patterns within their times tables and using mental maths strategies including 'counting on' to aid them to find the missing number. All of the children are focusing on money this term. We are learning to name and count coins, calculate totals and change

and begin to calculate budgets, profits and loss.

In Literacy, the children have engaged enthusiastically with our new writing project. They have focused tremendously well and have written some fantastic pieces. These have included designing a haunted house!

In Our I.D.L we are loving our Enterprise project which is developing products for the Christmas Fayre. The Learning Centre have decided to embrace the 'Office Style' and split into teams. One team is designing a game, which everyone will have an opportunity to play, and one team are designing decorations and making decorations to sell.

In Health and Wellbeing, we are continuing to work on our recognition of personal space and boundaries. Within this, we are looking at body language and how our body language can communicate how we are feeling but often lead to misunderstandings!
