We did it! Thanks to lots of hard work and commitment from the the whole JLB staff, we have achieved the OCTNE Bronze Award, confirming we are a 'Nurture and



Relationships Committed School'. Needless to say we are all delighted with this result and we will now aim to achieve the OCTNE Silver Award, over the course of the coming year. In order to achieve this we will have a Core Nurture Group, made up of staff from across the school, who will help with decision making, lead changes and offer support re Nurture to others. We will continue to develop our classrooms and wider school as nurturing environments and will maintain a strong focus on at least two of the Nurture Principles. In addition, all staff will have the opportunity to participate in Trauma Informed training.

We will be seeking the views of our children, parents, carers and wider community through use of questionnaires about JLB as a Nurturing school.

We are committed to taking Nurture forward across the whole school at JLB to ensure our school supports and encourages our pupils to achieve success and be the best they can, in a safe, understanding, supportive and positive environment, where the importance of strong relationships is key.



## Dogs in the Playground

Please be reminded that dogs are not permitted to enter the playground. If you have a dog you must stay well back from the school boundary. Unfortunately we have had a problem recently with dog's mess in the playground during collection time and we also have members of our school community that have allergies to dogs.

## **School Uniform**

We are making a concerted effort to encourage our children to come to school in uniform and would really appreciate your support in this. Please remember that our suggested uniform is as follows: P7, white shirt, new P7 school tie (yellow and blue stripes with 'Final Year' printed on it), blue 'V' neck with yellow stripe, /grey trousers / skirt/ pinafore and black shoes.

P1-6, white shirt, school tie (original design) plain blue 'v' neck, grey trousers/ skirt / pinafore and black shoes.

A blue and white summer dress may be worn in warmer weather.

All clothing brought to school should be labelled or marked in some way, as it is difficult for children to distinguish their own clothing from others.

## <u>PE Kits</u>

Pupils will continue to wear PE kit to school on their class PE days. Pupils should wear a white t-shirt and blue shorts (not denim) as their uniform for PE, (no cropped tops). Please also note that football strips, football colours and boots are not permitted. In winter grey or blue jogging bottoms are acceptable to wear on their PE days.

Jewellery should not be worn. For any earrings that are unable to be removed, tape should be provided throughout this limited time.

## **Classroom Bulletins**

Learning Centre

Hello!

In the Learning Centre we are having fun exploring a range of themes including Autumn, Diwali, Bonfire Night and our favourite- Christmas! In Literacy, the children are using visuals to develop





their vocabulary to describe the seasons and connect this to their own daily routines including appropriate clothing for the weather. During our daily sensory play activities the children are developing pre-writing skills by experiencing making moon sand, gloop and playdough as well as using various media to paint autumn pictures including broccoli and cauliflower!

We also use media including shaving foam to aid us in our learning of phonics and spelling sounds. As part of our sensory play we are making 'Diya' candles, Rangoli patterns and decorations for our Diwali celebration 'the festival of light'. The children will also have the opportunity to taste some traditional foods as part of this celebration.

In Numeracy we are exploring and developing our understanding of number facts to 10, 100 and 1000. We are continuing to investigate number sequences, learning about odd and even numbers and counting in thousands. We are also going to be learning about fractions and directions and symmetry.

In IDL we are enjoying learning about music across various cultures and traditional cultural dances. We have enjoyed exploring how our emotions are impacted by the music we listen to and how dancing makes us feel. We are excited to learn about various genres of music and compile a class playlist of our favourite songs.

#### Primary 7/6

P7/6 have a very busy term ahead and have hit the ground running. Children are extremely excited and enthusiastic



about the upcoming school performance and have already started researching the skills and qualities needed to be a fantastic stage performer. The children have all recently taken part in the audition process where they were given time to rehearse in small groups for their chosen parts. Following this the class developed a list of success criteria prior to their own audition. Children are patiently awaiting their role castings in the coming days when the rehearsals will begin.

In addition to the performance, P7/6 have their class assembly coming up and are working hard learning all about WW1 and Remembrance Day. Children are researching key events throughout the war and will be making their own poppies to wear in memory of those who fought in the war. Children are looking forward to sharing their learning with their families on Friday 8th November.

Children in P7/6 continue to work hard across the rest of the curriculum. In writing children are exploring emotional vocabulary and how this can be used in personal writing, and in maths children will be continuing to develop their maths mastery with more of a focus on shape and measure in connection with prop design for our upcoming performance.

## Primary 5/4

This term in literacy, P5/4 will be focusing on personal writing as they create journal entries to log their thoughts, feelings and progress as we work towards putting on our school show. P5/4 will also continue to develop their reading and spelling abilities as well as their listening and communication skills.



In numeracy, the children have been working hard to learn their times tables and soon we will be moving on to division. We will also be learning about shape and symmetry later in the term and this will help us to create lots of eye-catching props and backdrops for our show.

P5/4 will be very busy this term as we sing, dance, build, create and act our way towards our whole school performance of Aladdin' Trouble. The children are already working hard to learn the words and create dance sequences for our songs which we can't wait to share with you during our performance.

## Primary 3

This term in Literacy Primary 3 are learning about the different aspects of imaginary writing, creating characters, settings, problems and solutions. We are also learning to create eye-catching posters to advertise our upcoming show Aladdin. We will be continuing to work hard on our reading, phonics and spelling.

During Numeracy we are focussing on measure, working alongside P2/1 learning about the different units of measurement and when to use the appropriate unit, we will then be using this learning to design props for our show.

Primary 3 are currently taking part in rugby taster sessions that have been organised with Live Argyll which they are really enjoying.

Through IDL we are looking at different dances from across the world and

creating group dance routines, performing them to the rest of the class. They are playing an active role in the Aladdin show learning lines and songs along with helping to create props with P4,5,6 and 7.

## Primary 2/1

This term in Maths Primary 2/1 are learning about measure. They are exploring using a range of objects to measure length, weight and capacity through play. They will apply their learning as they measure out lengths of the props that they are going to create for "Aladdin Trouble".

In IDL they have been exploring music and dance form across the world. They have really enjoyed listening to and watching Ballroom Dancing, Hip hop, Jive, and Ballet to name but a few! During play they will explore dance steps and moves and create their own dance sequences and explore a range of musical instruments to create some music!
