Dear Parents and Carers,



Primary 2/1

P2/1 have been delving into life on the Isle of Struay through the stories of Katie Morag. We have enjoyed investigating the differences in lifestyle between a remote island and a city on the mainland. Grannie Island and Granma Mainland have provided an entertaining comparison for us to explore. We have also investigated the use of Scots language in the stories - most children agreed their room was a "midden", just like Katie Morag's!

They have also been learning all about how to tell the time and have learned about "O'clock" and "Half past" times.

They have really enjoyed their French lessons and use their puppets to practise greeting each other using French songs.

Primary 3

Primary 3 have been creating their own version of "The Animals went in Two by Two". We discussed the rhyming pattern





and the children had to follow this pattern for their version. We have also been learning about the Scots language, finding the definitions of the common Scots words. We are about to start our novel study of "How to Train your Dragon" which the children are very excited about. This will involve reading together, finding definitions of unfamiliar words and taking part in whole class comprehension discussions.

For Numeracy we are continuing to learn about money. We have been identifying coins and notes, adding amounts and we are about to start calculating change. We will then be moving onto Time and Data Handling.

Our IDL topic this term is water and from discussions with the children they would like to learn about the water cycle and looking after our water to protect our aquatic life. We are beginning to take our learning outdoors, exploring our local community and developing our problem solving skills.

Primary 5/4

This term in Literacy, P5/4 will be focusing on using our imagination and ambitious vocabulary to write imaginative stories. We will be creating our own characters, settings and story plots both independently and as a class. P5/4 will also continue to develop their reading, spelling and handwriting abilities as well as their listening and communication skills through our active in-class lessons and outdoor learning experiences.

In Numeracy, the children are working hard to develop their mental maths skills. We have recently finished a block of money lessons where the children were making new amounts and making change using

notes and coins. We are now learning how to gather and present data in a variety of charts and graphs. The children will be gathering data from their peers and in the outdoors which they will share with you on Seesaw.

Throughout our new water topic, P5/4 will develop their understanding of values and human rights as they work together to complete experiments and solve problems. We will investigate floating and sinking, the effects of temperature, the water cycle and water filtration. Many of our projects and experiments will be carried out during our outdoor learning lessons in the school grounds and in the local community.

Primary 7/6

IDL Topic – Water. During this topic the class will develop their views about values such as fairness, equality, love, caring, sharing and human rights. We will investigate water usage, clean water and explore through investigation methods to clean and conserve water. This will include significant outdoor learning opportunities, taking advantage of the local environment.

Numeracy & Mathematics – We continue to develop our mental maths knowledge and skills, alongside exploring, ordering, comparing and carrying out calculations with fractions.

Literacy – The class are enjoying reading their class novel 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo and 'Mr Majeika' by Humphrey Carpenter. We are extending our vocabulary, identifying writing techniques and building compression skills.

Learning Centre





In the learning centre we have had lots of fun learning about Scotland. We listened to traditional Scottish music and learned about the poet Robert Burns. The children thoroughly enjoyed engaging in a Burns Supper and tasting some traditional Scottish foods including 'haggis, neeps and tatties'. This term we will also be learning about water. The children are keen to engage in science experiments involving water and its changing states. They are also keen to learn about how we use water, preserving water and our environment and saving our oceans!

In Numeracy we are gaining confidence to solve mathematical problems including word problems and developing our understanding of the processes involved. We have also explored time concepts and gained accuracy in our ability to tell the time focusing on o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. We have enjoyed learning about seasons and matching the months of the year and appropriate clothing and events to the relevant season. We are going to be learning about reading calendars and calculating durations of time next.

In literacy we have enjoyed exploring the differences between fiction and non-fiction. We have explored the features of nonfiction texts including the contents page and indexes and used these to help us find information. We have also investigated the difference between facts and opinions. We have been exploring the difference in language between statements of fact and opinions and can recognise these in texts with growing confidence. We have also recognised the importance of valuing each other's opinions, even if they differ from our own. We have connected this to our rights and recognise that we all have a right to think and believe what we choose to as long as these do not stop other people from enjoying their rights (UNCRC 14).

In our Health and Wellbeing we have been learning about the perspectives of others and continuing to develop our emotional literacy. We are developing confidence to name our emotions and how these can make us feel.

Learning Support

For Conversational English, Mr. Lopez has been introducing winter vocabulary in addition to frequently used common words. Currently, we are enjoying and carrying out a craft task about clothing (good for the cold/wet weather). The classes have been reading and writing about verbs (action words) both in present and past tenses to describe what they do today (daily routine) compared to what they did yesterday or during the holidays. We will chat and learn things about Ramadan and Easter. We are also exploring and discussing identity, culture, resilience and being unique. For Nurture, we are learning about the importance of transitions including visits to Hermitage Academy.

Scot's X Factor

Our Scot's X Factor afternoon was a huge success and we were entertained by all of our wonderful contestants with a delightful array of performances ranging from "Ye Canny Shove yer Granny aff the Bus" to Robert Burns poetry. Well done to all our winners pictured below!
